Loretta Messer's modest little house badly needed repairs. Now she can stay in her home because of repairs and remodeling funded by Austin Housing Bonds.



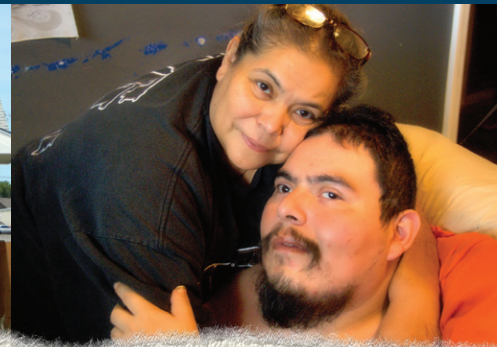
